Election Commission Meeting

Fenton Area Cable Television Consortium

Trustee McKenna reported that the FACT Consortium had recently approved a grant application from 3 District Productions for approximately \$60,000 to purchase new equipment.

Law Enforcement Update

Trustee Mathis reported that she is very concerned about the activities that took place on Lake Fenton over the July 4th weekend. She is especially concerned about the so-called

"Belly-Flop" contest that seems to grow larger each year. Board members agreed that this and other events are getting out of hand. The township will work with the Genesee County Sheriff Department to formulate a plan to provide more control in future years.

Proposed Road Improvement Project - Lobdell Road

Supervisor Gabrielson reviewed a memo regarding a proposed project to pave Lobdell Road. With a daily vehicle count of over 2,000, it is by far the most heavily traveled unpaved road in Fenton Township. The preliminary cost estimate to pave the Fenton Township section of Lobdell Road is \$400,000. This type of cost has always been too much for our budget to absorb for a local road improvement. However, recent discussions with the Genesee County Road Commission have led us to a new possibility. The road commission has indicated a willingness to approach the Genesee County Board of Commissioners to issue bonds to fund this project. If approved, it would allow the township to spread the cost over a ten year period. Payments to the county would be similar to the "at-large" portion of special assessments we currently pay. If the board is favorable to this approach, a motion to approve submission of an appropriate letter of request to the Genesee County Road Commission would be in order.

Clerk Mueller asked the board to allow him to abstain from voting on this issue. He owns a significant amount of frontage on Lobdell Road and voting on the issue may represent a conflict of interest.

Motion to allow Clerk Mueller to abstain from voting on the issue of paving Lobdell Road, due to a possible conflict of interest.

Fenton Township Firefighters Association Constitution

Proposed Sewer Extension Project – North Road

Supervisor Gabrielson reviewed a memo regarding the need for a new sewer line on North Road. Because the sewer line installed by the Grandma's Loft establishment has been designated as a lead by Genesee County Water & Waste Services, no additional connections can be made to that line. A line is needed to service the new Chrysler dealership, (site plan already approved), and other homes and businesses in the area. The preliminary cost estimate from Rowe Incorporated is just under \$300,000.00.

Motion to authorize the development of construction plans for the North Road Sewer Project and to solicit competitive bids for the construction of said project.
