Rezoning #R04-010, Cygnet Automated Cleaning, Inc., parcel 06-02-400-019 (2229 Thompson Road); R-4 to PUD/2nd Reading

Supervisor Mathis noted that, at the 12/6/04 meeting, the board had discussed postponing this rezoning to the January 10th meeting. The board was in agreement with the postponement, however no formal action was taken to do so. Therefore the rezoning still appears on tonight's agenda only for the purpose of formally postponing the second reading until the January 10th meeting.

Proposed Amendment to Traffic Code Ordinance/2nd Reading

Supervisor Mathis briefly reviewed the proposed amendment to the Township's Traffic Code Ordinance, which was introduced at the 12/6/04 meeting. The proposed amendment adopts the Motor Carrier Safety Act of 1963 (MCL 480.11-480.22) by reference. This will allow the Township to collect fees for overweight truck violations that occur within our boundaries. There was no further discussion.

Rezoning #R04-13, Community Concepts Inc., parcels 06-07-400-002/06-08-300-015, (north side of Lahring Road, east of Sharp Road); AG to R-3/1st Reading

Supervisor Mathis reviewed the proposed rezoning. Trustee Gatesman reported that the Land Use Plan designation for the property is *Low Density Residential*, however the availability of sewer makes it appropriate for *Medium Density Residential*. The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the rezoning.

Steve Rumple, representing the applicant, noted that the rezoning request is consistent with the Township's Land Use Plan and fits with surrounding zoning.

Public Comment:

Susan Foland, 11421 Fairbanks Road

Ms. Foland, President of the Fenton Township Residents Association, expressed concern regarding the impact of another residential development on schools and roads. She asked why the rezoning to R-3 was recommended for approval when the Land Use Plan calls for low density residential. Trustee Gatesman responded that the Land Use Plan states that low density areas would be appropriate for medium density development if sewer is available.

Dave Hawcroft, 3302 Ponemah Drive

Mr. Hawcroft stated that he is also concerned about the impact of new development on roads, schools and sewers.

Gary Carlson, 14041 Squaw Lake Drive

Mr. Carlson asked if the school districts are notified of rezoning requests. It was confirmed that school districts are not specifically notified of rezoning requests.

Treasurer Carmody stated that he understands and shares many of the concerns expressed by the residents, but also recognizes that the Township must consider legal issues when making these decisions. Supervisor Mathis added that the Township Board will be scheduling a workshop meeting with the Planning Commission in the near future to discuss development issues.

The second reading of the proposed rezoning ordinance will be conducted at the 1/10/05 meeting.

Resolution No. 2004-56, 2005 Sewer Bond Payments

Office Manager Broecker reviewed a letter from Genesee County Water & Waste Services requesting a resolution identifying the source of funds for payment of 2005 sewer bond debt obligations. This resolution was delayed in order to include the payments for the bonds that were sold earlier this month. Clerk Krug presented the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Charter Township of Fenton has a need to pay to the County of Genesee the sum of \$2,144,531.94 to meet the bond principal and interest requirements on all bond obligations for sewer facilities in 2005; and

WHEREAS, there are several means by which the funds can be secured to meet these payments; and

WHEREAS, all various means of securing these funds have been reviewed and considered:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Charter Township of Fenton, that the monies to meet the principal and interest requirements on all bond obligations for sewer facilities in 2005 will be secured from the following funds.

Proposed Employment Agreement - Fire Chief John Moulton

Supervisor Mathis reviewed a proposed 3-year employment agreement for Fire Chief John Moulton. The agreement is virtually identical to the existing agreement. The annual salary increases remain at 3.5%, and language has been added to require the Fire Chief to establish a framework of goals and objectives for the Fire Department. The Personnel Committee has reviewed the proposed agreement and has recommended approval. Clerk Krug stated that the addition of a goal-based performance evaluation should be a valuable tool in the continued development of the Fire Department.

Trustee Zimmer questioned the use of the Fire Chief as a backup Building Inspector. Supervisor Mathis explained that Chief Moulton is a certified Building Inspector and helps out by completing inspections when our regular inspector is absent or when the inspection volume is very high. This has proven to be very cost effective since it reduces our reliance on outside inspectors to cover those situations.

<u>Proposed 2005 GIS Services Agreement – North Arrow Technologies, Inc.</u>

Supervisor Mathis reviewed the proposed GIS services agreement with North Arrow Technologies for 2005. In addition to routine GIS updates, special projects have been included to identify and map easements and to assist in the development of an emergency preparedness plan (\$41,000 combined total). Because the Township is still investigating the ultimate direction of maintenance of the Cityworks database and the Township's website, language has been added to give the Township the option of eliminating these two items from the Scope of Work. The total projected cost for 2005 is approximately \$94,000.00. The board briefly discussed the Township's existing website. Several enhancements, including the availability of meeting minutes and summaries on the website, are being worked on. Treasurer Carmody asked if the overall project to develop the Township's GIS has resulted in any work product that could potentially be patented or copyrighted. Office Manager Broecker clarified that all software utilized was purchased commercially. Our project has created GIS "layers" and other data, but nothing that could be patented.

Michigan Law, the Election Commission of a charter township must consist of the Township Clerk and two Trustees. Clerk Krug is recommending the appointment of Trustees Brown and Gatesman for this commission.

PUBLIC COMMENT - AGENDA OR NON-AGENDA ITEMS:

DuWayne Stratman, 12420 Darts Drive

Mr. Stratman raised concerns regarding a neighbor that is renting out a part of her home, which is a violation of the Township's Zoning Ordinance. He made the following specific claims:

- 1. The property owner has misrepresented the rental as a family member living with her.
- 2. The property owner is claiming 100% homestead exemption.
- 3. The property is being billed for only one sewer unit.

Supervisor Mathis read a letter from Fenton Township Zoning Administrator Doug Piggott, which classified the use of the subject property for rental as a legal non-conforming use. This decision was based on information provided by the property owner.

Mr. Stratman asked how this property could be rezoned without a proper hearing. Clerk Krug clarified that the property was not rezoned. The rental situation has been classified as a legal non-conforming use.

Supervisor Mathis stated that she would investigate the issue further and suggested that Mr. Stratman make an appointment with the Zoning Administrator to voice his concerns.

Les Scott, 12499 Margaret Drive

Regarding the earlier discussion on the Township's website, Mr. Scott stated that he supports any upgrades or enhancements that can be accomplished.

The board briefly discussed the possibility of conducting a workshop meeting with the Planning Commission. A date of Monday January 17, 2005 at 7:00 p.m. was tentatively set, subject to the availability of Planning Commission members.
