#### PRESENTATION:

## **Genesee County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority**

Supervisor Mathis introduced Patrick Greve and Art Potter of the Genesee County Land Bank and Brownfield Redevelopment Authority. Mr. Greve gave a brief overview of the Land Bank's program to rehabilitate tax reverted properties in order to sell them and get them back on the local tax rolls. He reported that amendments have been proposed for the Land Bank's Brownfield Plan. Although no new properties have been added from Fenton Township, they still need local units of government to adopt a resolution to approve the amended plan.

# **Public Comment:**

Beth Redmond, Fenton Township Assessor

Ms. Redmond asked what happens to special assessments on properties that are reverted to the Land Bank. Mr. Potter responded that such properties are exempt from taxes and special assessments, except for specials tied to financing, (i.e. loans or bonds), that constitute a lien on the property. Once a property is sold and put back on the tax roll, special assessments can begin again.

The appropriate resolution will be prepared and placed on the agenda for the 2/20/06 meeting.

## Josh's Room Update

Supervisor Mathis and Trustee Zimmer reported that the project to construct a handicap accessible living space for local youth Josh Knapp is progressing well. There are now eight contracting firms involved in the project, including one that specializes in construction for handicapped individuals. The family is also receiving free legal assistance from two attorneys that are donating their services. An account has been opened at Citizens Bank to accept donations and they urged everyone to get the word out that donations will be needed to make this project successful.

# **Loose Senior Citizen Center Update**

Trustee Zimmer reported that the Interlocal Agreement for the Loose Senior Citizen Center has expired. She would like this issue placed on the agenda for the next available workshop meeting.

# Fenton Area Cable Television (FACT) Consortium Update

Treasurer Carmody reported that all member communities have approved the allocation of funds for the Township's project to purchase television equipment. Our goal is to have the equipment purchased, installed and operational by summer.

# **ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES:**

# Proposed Wild, Dangerous and Vicious Animals Ordinance/1st Reading

Supervisor Mathis introduced a proposed ordinance to prohibit the keeping of wild, dangerous and vicious animals in Fenton Township. Although similar language is in the Zoning Ordinance it is felt that a general or "police power" ordinance will be more effective for enforcement purposes. There was no public comment. The board discussed the language of the proposed ordinance. Trustee Goupil expressed concern that the

language was not clear enough. The definition of "dangerous animal", for instance, could be interpreted to include almost any pet dog. Attorney Cooley stated that the language is intentionally vague in some areas to give the Township more flexibility in enforcement. The proposed ordinance will be reviewed for possible changes before coming back to the board.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

## **Project Award – Barrier Free Door Improvements (CDBG)**

Supervisor Mathis reported that proposal packets for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) project to make barrier-free improvements to the Township Hall entrances were mailed to six companies in early January. Additionally, a notice was published in the local newspaper and posted on the Township website indicating that the Township was seeking proposals for this project. When the January 27<sup>th</sup> deadline arrived, the Township received only one proposal. The board reviewed a copy of the proposal from Detroit Door & Hardware Company. Detroit Door & Hardware is a local Genesee County firm that has been in business for many years. They are also the service provider that established the current keying system at the Fenton Township Civic Community Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Supervisor and the Township Clerk be and are authorized to execute such authorizations for change on behalf of the Charter Township of Fenton.
