#### **APPROVAL OF AGENDA:**

### **Fire Chief Report**

Fire Chief Moulton provided Fire Department statistics for the month of November: 39 total alarms (1 in Tyrone Township). Of those alarms there were 0 fires, 23 EMS calls, 13 service calls and 3 good intent calls.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

## **Proposed 2010 Fenton Township Budget**

Supervisor Mathis reported that the proposed 2010 Fenton Township budget was distributed to the board at the last meeting and has also been on file at the Township office and posted on the Township's website. She reviewed the total revenue projections for each fund. The board reviewed the entire budget by cost center. It was noted that the proposed budget for the General Fund and Fire Fund are "balanced budgets" (revenues = expenditures). In the Solid Waste Management and Mosquito Control budgets, the expenditures are higher than the revenues since both funds have sufficient fund balances. The Sewer Fund projection includes revenues/cash inflows exceeding expenditures/cash outflows by approximately \$250,000. Treasurer Tucker stated that he is pleased that the Township is able to maintain a balanced budget despite the difficult economic conditions.

There was no public comment. Clerk Krug presented the following resolution:

## RESOLUTION NO. 2009-39 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT

A resolution to establish a general appropriations act for the Charter Township of Fenton; to define the powers and duties of the Fenton Township officers in relation to the administration of the budget; and to provide remedies for refusal or neglect to comply with the requirements of this resolution.

The Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Fenton resolves:

#### Section 1: Title

This resolution shall be known as the Fenton Township General Appropriations Act.

#### Section 2: Chief Administrative Officer

The Supervisor shall be the Chief Administrative Officer and shall perform the duties of the Chief Administrative Officer enumerated in this act.

## **Section 3: Fiscal Officer**

The Clerk shall be the Fiscal Officer and shall perform the duties of the Fiscal Officer enumerated in this act.

#### **Section 4: Public Hearings on the Budget**

Pursuant to MCLA 42.26, notice of a public hearing on the proposed budget was published on the Township's website and posted at the office of the Township Clerk, and a public hearing on the proposed budget was held on December 7, 2009.

#### **Section 5: Estimated Revenues**

Estimated township General Fund revenues for fiscal year 2010, including an operating millage of .7122 mills, and various miscellaneous revenues shall total \$2,236,800.

Estimated township Fire Fund revenues for fiscal year 2010 shall total \$636,500.

Estimated township Sewer Fund revenues for fiscal year 2010 shall total \$6,357,500.

Estimated township Mosquito Control Fund revenues for fiscal year 2010 shall total \$154,500.

Estimated township Solid Waste Management Fund revenues for fiscal year 2010 shall total \$718,500.

### Section 6: Millage Levy

The Fenton Township Board shall cause to be levied and collected the general property tax on all real and personal property within the township upon the current tax roll an amount equal to .7122 mills for general township operations.

Estimated township Mosquito Control Fund expenditures for fiscal year 2010 shall total \$165,000.

Estimated township Solid Waste Management Fund expenditures for fiscal year 2010 shall total \$722,500.

### Section 8: Adoption of Budget by Reference

The General Fund, Sewer Fund, Fire Fund, Mosquito Control Fund and Solid Waste Management Fund budgets of the Charter Township of Fenton are hereby adopted by reference, with revenues and activity expenditures as indicated in Sections 5 and 7 of this act.

### Section 9: Adoption of Budget by Cost Center

The Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Fenton adopts the 2010 fiscal year General Fund and Fire Fund Budgets and the Sewer Fund Financial Projections by cost center. Township officials responsible for the expenditures authorized in the budget are authorized to expend township funds up to, but not to exceed, the total appropriation authorized for each cost center, and to make transfers among the various line items contained in the cost center appropriation.

## Section 10: Appropriation not a Mandate to Spend

Appropriations shall be deemed maximum authorizations to incur expenditures. The fiscal officer shall exercise supervision and control to ensure that expenditures are within appropriations, and shall not issue any township order for expenditures that exceed appropriations.

## **Section 11: Transfer Authority**

The Chief Administrative Officer shall have the authority to make transfers among the various cost centers without prior board approval, if the amount to be transferred does not exceed \$10,000 or 10% of the appropriation item from which the transfer is to be made, whichever is less. The Board shall be notified at its next meeting of any such transfer made, and reserves the right to modify, amend or nullify any such transfers made. Under no circumstances may the total General Fund budget be changed without prior board approval.

#### Section 12: Periodic Fiscal Reports

The fiscal officer shall transmit to the board within 30 days of the end of each quarter, a report of financial operations, including, but not limited to:

- a. a summary statement showing the receipts and expenditures and encumbrances for the previous month, and for the current fiscal year to the end of the previous month.
- b. a detailed list of:
  - i. expected revenues by major source as estimated in the budget; actual receipts to date for the current fiscal year; and the balance of estimated revenues to be collected in the then current fiscal year.
  - ii. for each cost center: the amount appropriated; the year-to-date amount charged to each appropriation in the previous quarter for the current fiscal year; and the unencumbered balance of appropriations;

## Section 13: Limit on Obligations and Payments

No obligation shall be incurred against, and no payment shall be made from any appropriation account unless there is sufficient unencumbered balance in the appropriation and sufficient funds are or will be available to meet the obligation.

### Section 14: Budget Monitoring

Whenever it appears to the Chief Administrative Officer or Township Board that the actual and probable revenues in any fund will be less that the estimated revenues upon which appropriations from such fund were based, and when it appears that the expenditures shall exceed an appropriation, the Chief Administrative Officer shall present to the township board recommendations to prevent expenditures from exceeding available revenues or appropriations for the current fiscal year. Such recommendations shall include proposals for reducing appropriations, increasing revenues, or both.

#### **Section 15: Violations of This Act**

Any obligation incurred or payment authorized in violation of this resolution shall be void and shall subject any responsible official(s) or employee(s) to disciplinary action as outlined in P.A. 621 (1978).

## **ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES:**

Proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment–Special Use Permit Reviews/1<sup>st</sup> Reading

language regarding the review of special use permits. Treasurer Tucker explained that
the amendment would establish a more formal review process for Special Use Permits.

Mr. Hawcroft asked for a clarification of the intent of this ordinance. Treasurer Tucker explained that the review language is being added to the existing provisions regarding Special Use Permits to give the Planning Commission the authority to review and address non-compliance issues.

## Proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment - Wind Energy Systems/1st Reading

Supervisor Mathis introduced a proposed Zoning Ordinance amendment to add language regarding wind energy systems. Treasurer Tucker stated that wind energy is being looked to nationwide as a "green" energy alternative. The proposed ordinance addresses both large and small scale systems.

## Proposed Sign Ordinance Amendment – Digital Signs/1<sup>st</sup> reading

Supervisor Mathis introduced a proposed amendment to the Sign Regulation Ordinance to add language regarding digital signs. Treasurer Tucker noted that the Township's existing Sign Regulation ordinance does not address digital signs. The proposed amendment adds language to deal with the newer technology. Full motion video signs are prohibited and other digital signs would be subject to specific criteria.

### Proposed 2010 GIS Services Agreement – North Arrow Technologies, Inc.

Operations Manager Broecker noted that the hourly rates are the same as the 2009 contract. The total projected cost for 2010 is approximately \$55,500.00, which is \$3,500 less than the 2009 contract.

Mr. Hawcroft asked if the increase in foreclosures and decrease in property values are impacting the Township financially. Treasurer Tucker stated that the decreased tax base certainly has a negative impact on the Township's revenues. Because we only levy 0.7122 mills, however, the financial impact on Fenton Township is less severe than in most communities.
