PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Little Long Lake Improvement Special Assessment District/Hearing on Special Assessment Roll

Supervisor Mathis opened a public hearing on the special assessment roll for a 5-year special assessment district for improvements to Little Long Lake through the eradication and control of aquatic weeds. The total 5-year cost of the project is approximately \$19,000.00. The assessment per parcel in the proposed special assessment roll is \$104.90 for 2013 and \$93.63 for 2014 through 2017. The board will accept public comment regarding the following:

- 1. An individual's assessment in relation to benefit received.
- 2. The total cost of the project.
- 3. The validity of the proceedings to date.

There was no public comment. Clerk Krug presented the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-20

WHEREAS, the township board of the Charter Township of Fenton, Genesee County, Michigan, after due and legal notice, has conducted a public hearing upon a proposed assessment roll prepared by the supervisor and assessing officer of the Township for the purpose of defraying the costs of the weed eradication/control project proposed to be initiated within the Little Long Lake Improvement Special Assessment District as shown on the plans and specifications for such project, and

WHEREAS, such public hearing was preceded by proper notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the Township, and by First Class Mail notice to each property owner of record within said district and upon said assessment roll, and

WHEREAS, all present at said public hearing were given the opportunity to be heard in the matter, and

WHEREAS, no written objections were received to said roll and levy, and

WHEREAS, a record of those present to protest, and of written protests submitted at or before the public hearing was made a part of the minutes of the hearing, and

WHEREAS, the Township Board has duly inspected the proposed assessment roll and considered all comments and proposed amendments thereto and has found the proposed assessment roll, as submitted, to be correct, just and reasonable;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the assessment roll submitted by the supervisor and assessing officer of the Township shall hereafter be designated as Fenton Township Special Assessment Roll No. 2013-2 and shall hereby be confirmed as the assessment roll for the Little Long Lake Improvement Special Assessment District, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the assessments in said Fenton Township Special Assessment Roll No. 2013-2 shall be divided into five annual installments with the first installment due on or before December 1, 2013 and the following installments to be due on or before the first day of December for each year thereafter indicated, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that future due installments of an assessment against any parcel of land may be paid to the Township Treasurer at any time in full. If any installment of a special assessment is not paid when due, then the installment shall be considered to be delinquent and there shall be collected a penalty at the rate of 1% for each month, or fraction of a month, that the installment remains unpaid before being reported to the Township Board for reassessment upon the Township tax roll, in accordance with Michigan P.A. 188 of 1954, as amended, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the assessments made in said special assessment roll are hereby ordered and directed to be collected by the Township Treasurer, and the Township Clerk shall deliver said special assessment roll to said Treasurer with his warrant attached, commanding the Treasurer to collect such assessments in accordance with the direction of the Township Board and said P.A. 188 of 1954, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that all resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same are hereby rescinded.

<u>Application for Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate – Paragon Manufacturing Corporation</u>

Supervisor Mathis opened a public hearing for the purpose of considering the application of Paragon Manufacturing Corporation for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate (tax abatement) for new equipment at their existing facility on Thompson Road. The total cost of the new equipment is \$526,000.00 and it is anticipated that the acquisition of the equipment will allow Paragon to create 5 new jobs and retain 3 existing jobs at their facility.

There was no public comment. Clerk Krug reviewed the rating sheet used by Fenton Township for determining the length of the abatement. Based on the type and amount of investment, and the number of new jobs, the recommended term is eight years.

Treasurer Tucker stated that he is related to the applicant and asked to abstain from voting on the issue due to a perceived conflict of interest.

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-21

WHEREAS, pursuant to P.A. 198 of 1974, M.C.L. 207.551 et seq., after a duly noticed public hearing held on October 7, 1996, this Township Board by resolution established Industrial Development District No. 10; and

WHEREAS, Paragon Manufacturing Corporation has filed an application for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate with regard to new equipment installed at their facility located within Industrial Development District No. 10; and

WHEREAS, before acting on said application, the Charter Township of Fenton held a public hearing on October 7, 2013 at the Fenton Township Civic Community Center in Fenton, Michigan at 7:30 p.m., at which hearing the applicant, the Assessor

and representatives of the affected taxing units were given written notice and were afforded an opportunity to be heard on said application; and

WHEREAS, the approval of the certificate will have the reasonable likelihood to retain, create, or prevent the loss of employment in the Charter Township of Fenton; and

WHEREAS, the aggregate SEV of real and personal property exempt from ad valorem taxes within the Charter Township of Fenton, after granting this certificate, will not exceed 5% of an amount equal to the sum of the SEV of the unit, plus the SEV of personal and real property thus exempted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Township Board of the Charter Township of Fenton that:

- 1. The Township Board finds and determines that the granting of the Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate considered together with the aggregate amount of certificates previously granted and currently in force under Act No 198 of the Public Acts of 1974 and Act No. 255 of the Public Acts of 1978, shall not have the effect of substantially impeding the operation of the Charter Township of Fenton, or impairing the financial soundness of a taxing unit which levies ad valorem property taxes in the Charter Township of Fenton.
- The application of Paragon Manufacturing Corporation for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate with respect to personal property acquired and installed on the following described parcel of real property situated within the Industrial Development District No. 10, to wit:

Part of the NE 1/4 of Section 2, T5N R6E, Township of Fenton, County of Genesee, Michigan, more particularly described as: beginning at the E 1/4 corner of said section; thence S 87° 39' W 660.54 feet; thence north 1349.94'; thence S 89° 49' 50" E 660.0 feet; thence S 1321.03 feet to a point of beginning, subject to the Southerly 50.0 feet, used as Thompson Road, so-called.

3. The Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate when issued shall be and remain in force and effect for a period of 8 years.

Proposed Revisions to Fenton Township Fee Schedule

Supervisor Mathis reviewed a proposed revision to the township's fee schedule. The only proposed changes are for grading plan review fees, which are proposed to be increased to better cover the actual cost.

PEG Grant Applications – Lake Fenton, Linden & Fenton Schools

Supervisor Mathis reported that Lake Fenton, Linden and Fenton school districts have submitted a combined PEG grant application to upgrade and replace video equipment for their high school programs. The FACT Consortium has reviewed and approved the application, and recommended approval of funding up to a maximum of \$175,544.43.

The allocation of the costs is based on annual PEG fee receipts for each community. The \$175,544.43 will be allocated as follows:

The last time PEG grant funding was approved, the actual costs were significantly lower than what was approved due to price reductions between the time the proposal was developed and when the equipment was actually ordered. This resulted in all three school districts returning funds to all four municipalities. To avoid that situation, the FACT Consortium has requested that the municipalities approve an "up to" amount to allow the orders to be placed. Payments to the school districts will occur after the actual costs are finalized.

Lake Fenton Schools Superintendent Wayne Wright stated that the equipment purchased with the grant funds would be for the school programs, which are responsible for the majority of the content on public access channel 99. These school programs are growing rapidly and additional equipment is needed. Lake Fenton teacher Nicole Chapman stated that her program has grown to 160 students. These classes give the students skills that can lead to exciting careers. Fenton teacher Rich Ashley stated that his program includes 175 students. More than 400 students signed up for the class but it had to be cut off at 175 due to a lack of equipment.

It was also noted that Channel 99 now carries programming 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Clerk Krug stated that the equipment purchases are a good use of these funds. Trustee Lorraine asked how the equipment is procured. Mr. Ashley stated that the three school districts purchased jointly to take advantage of price breaks. Prices are obtained from a minimum of three vendors, and each different piece of equipment is purchased at the lowest price, (i.e. the final order will likely be from more than one vendor).

It was also emphasized that these funds are from the Township's restricted fund balance. PEG fees can only be used to support PEG television programming. They cannot be used for any other purpose.

Motion to approve funding for the PEG Grant applications of Lake Fenton Community Schools, Fenton Area Public Schools and Linden Community Schools up to a total amount of \$72,570.76, as presented.

Clerk Krug noted that Lake Fenton High School's homecoming parade will be on North Long Lake Road between 4-6 p.m. this Friday 10/11/13. He also invited everyone to attend the "5th Quarter" a fundraising event hosted by the Lake Fenton Community Schools Foundation. It will be held at Fenton Farms Golf Club right after the homecoming football game, (21 & older only).

Clerk Krug also reminded the board and audience that the final fall farmer's market will be this Sunday, 10/13/13, at the Lake Fenton Middle School from 1-4 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT – AGENDA OR NON-AGENDA ITEMS:

Dave Hawcroft, 3302 Ponemah Drive

Mr. Hawcroft asked who owns the former Frank's Tavern property. Supervisor Mathis confirmed that the Township owns it. The ownership defaulted to the Township due to property tax foreclosure. Mr. Hawcroft asked why the Township would use taxpayer dollars to demolish the building. Clerk Krug clarified that CDBG grant funds will be used for the demolition, not local taxpayer funds. Trustees Shumaker and Goupil added that Fenton Township typically has difficulty identifying eligible CDBG projects due to the

tight federal restrictions on the funding. Demolition of a blighted structure owned by the Township is eligible and is a good use of the funds.
