



Special Election: Fenton School Bond

There is a special election coming up on Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

Fenton Area Public Schools has a bond proposal on the ballot.

Only one of the six Fenton Township precincts will be eligible to vote in the special election.

Registered voters in Fenton Township precinct

4 will be able to cast their ballot regarding the bond. The map below details all six Fenton Township voting precincts.

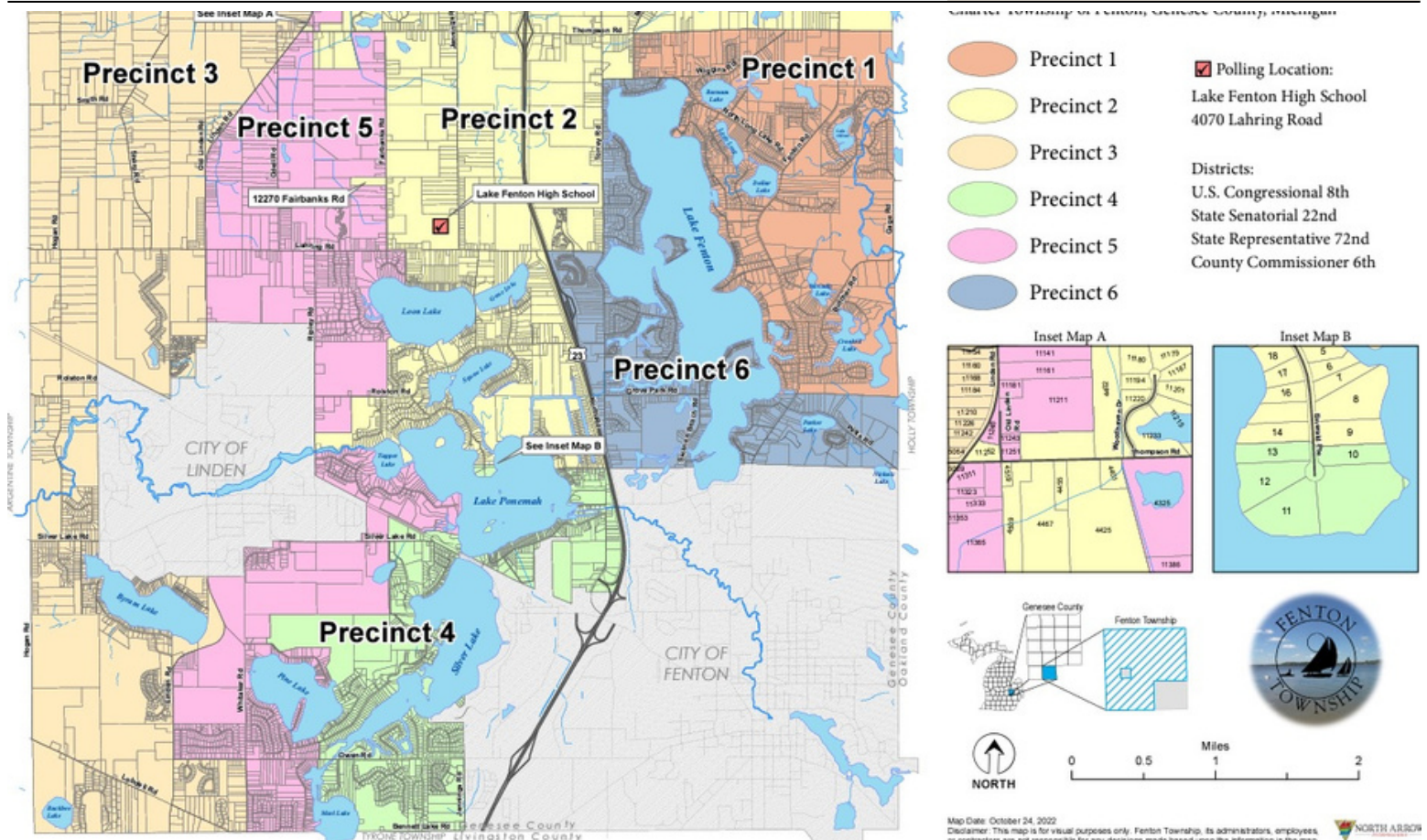

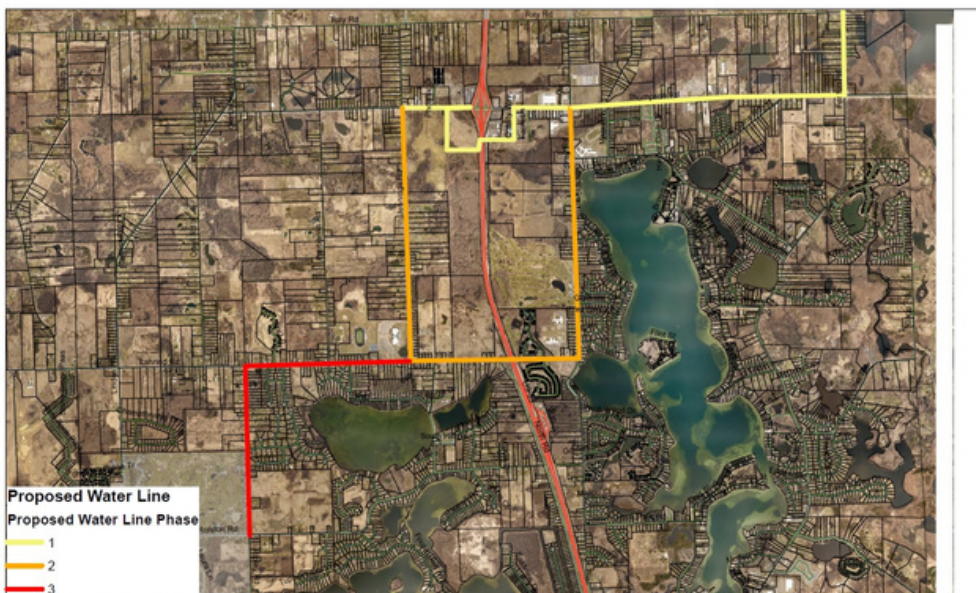
Book Your Event Now!

Utility E-Billing: Receive Your Sewer Bill Via E-mail

Fenton Township is offering the ability to receive your utility bill via e-mail rather than receiving a mailed post card.

This is not a billing portal; however, online payment

options are available; however, there is a fee to process the payment through the Invoice Cloud platform online or at the office.

You can sign up for utility e-billing on the Fenton

Township website.

Make Payments Online, Cards Now Accepted at the Fenton Township Office

Fenton Township residents can now pay online for permits, utility billing, and tax.

In September 2023, the Township switched to the Invoice Cloud payment processing platform from the ACI platform.

If you had created a login for the ACI system for making payments online you will need to make a new one for Invoice Cloud.

This new system is accessible via the Fenton Township website, and allows for credit card and electronic fund transfer (check) processing for payments to Fenton Township.

New options include, the ability to set up scheduled payments via the Invoice Cloud system.

This is an option for those that want to auto pay their flat rate utility bill on either a monthly or quarterly schedule. Or for those that may leave the state for travel and can schedule a payment before they leave.

Additionally, the new payment processing system allows for credit card transactions to take place at the Township Office front counter.

*All Invoice Cloud transactions, online or at the Township Office have a processing fee.

Fenton Township Front Desk FAQs

I live in Fenton Township, where can I submit my pistol permit?

The Office of the Genesee County Sheriff, located at 1002 S. Saginaw Street - Flint.

Can I use a credit or debit card as a payment option?

Yes. The Township Office has switched to Invoice Cloud which allows for online and over the counter card processing.

We cannot accept card payments over the phone.

All online and over the counter card transactions have a processing fee.

Can I set my sewer bill up for auto pay?

Not through the Township Office. You may be able to set it up through your bank. The flat rate of \$255 a quarter breaks down to \$85 a month for monthly payments.

Who do I call to have a large item picked up?

Republic Services: 888-872-7455
Fenton Township residents can schedule one large item pick up per week.

Can I get a 3-year dog license at the Fenton Township Office?

No, you would have to go through Genesee County Animal Control for a 3-year dog license.

The Township Office can only sell 1-year licenses within a month of the rabies vaccine being administered.

Fenton Township is finished with 2023 licenses and will start 2024 in the spring.

Can I get a copy of my property taxes?

You can call, email, or stop in to request a copy of your taxes. You can also access them any time on the Fenton Township website.

Where do I report a pothole?

To the Genesee County Road Commission.

You can either call the GCRC at 810-767-4920, or go on the Fenton Township website there is a link to report potholes under the "How Can I?" drop down menu.
