

## Top Fenton Township Recreation Spots

### Mantawauka Park & Beach

Located behind the Fenton Township Civic Community Center, the Mantawauka Park & Beach is one of the best-kept secrets in Fenton Township.

Park hours are from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m. daily.

The park includes a boardwalk access, a playground, a roped off swim area, and a gazebo.

Parking for Mantawauka Park is in the lower lot of the Fenton Township Hall parking area.



### Lake Ponemah

Lake Ponemah is part of the chain of lakes that includes Tupper Lake and the Shiawasee River. You can launch your kayak at the Ponemah DNR Boat Launch and make your way to the City of Linden.

The Thompson Road Regional Dog Park has two areas to separate out larger and smaller breed dogs. A well for fresh water. There are benches and dog play structures in both areas.

## Mosquito Treatment Information 2023

Fenton Township has contracted with Advanced Pest Management (APM) to provide mosquito control to the Township.

APM Mosquito Control has over 30 years of experience of being specialized in municipal and community-wide mosquito management programs.

There is an opt out of treatment form available on the Fenton Township website under the Mosquito Control section. \*Note that opting out of treatment does not relieve you from paying the voted millage.

As part of the Fenton Township contract with APM residents can request up to three property sprays a year. These are best done before an Open House or other outdoor event.

Residents can now call APM and request to be placed on a notification list for a call prior to their areas night time fogging treatment.

All treatments are weather dependent.

## 2023 Genesee County Dog Licenses Now Available

You can now stop in at the Fenton Township Office and obtain a 2023, 1-year Genesee County dog license.

You must bring in a current rabies vaccine record that shows the vaccine was administered within the last month. i.e., if you stop in during the month of April the vaccine can be March, April, or May (2022 - to do a 1-year renewal during a 3-year vaccine) administered.

Checks made out to Fenton Township, or cash, are accepted at the Fenton Township Office. There is no card reader at the Township Office.

## Fenton Township Front Desk FAQs

I live in Fenton Township, where can I submit my pistol permit?

The Office of the Genesee County Sheriff, which is located at 1002 S. Saginaw Street - Flint.

Can I use a credit or debit card to pay my sewer bill?

Yes. And No.

The Township Office does not currently have a card reader so we cannot accept card payments in the office or over the phone.

You can pay your sewer bill online with a card; however, there is a processing fee.

Can I set my sewer bill up for auto pay?

Not through the Township Office. You may be able to set it up through your bank. The flat rate of \$255 a quarter breaks down to \$85 a month for monthly payments.

Who do I call to have a large item picked up?

Republic Services: 888-872-7455  
Fenton Township residents can schedule one large item pick up per week.

Can I get a 3-year dog license at the Fenton Township Office?

No, you would have to go through Genesee County Animal Control for a 3-year dog license. The Township Office can only sell 1-year licenses within a month of the rabies vaccine being administered.

Can I get a copy of my property taxes?

You can call, email, or stop in to request a copy of your taxes. You can also access them any time on the Fenton Township website.

Where do I report a pothole?

Genesee County Road Commission. You can either call the GCRC at 810-767-4920, or go on the Fenton Township website there is a link to report potholes under the "How Can I?" drop down menu.

Does the Township offer free notary services?

Yes, Fenton Township has several staff members that can assist you.
