The Fenton Township Hall is freshly remodeled and ready to host your event!

Located in the lower level of the Fenton Township Civic Community Center, the hall is host to not only the Township meetings, but also community events like the annual Lake Fenton Athletic Boosters fundraiser or as part of the Lake Fenton Polar Plunge location with the hosting Moose Lodge.

Able to accommodate 200 guests, it includes two beer

taps, a walkout onto the patio, and a floor to ceiling view of Lake Fenton, the Hall is a one of a kind setting for your event.

Having a smaller event and don't need the full hall? Rent either the south side of the hall with the view of Lake Fenton, or you can rent the half with the board table for a meeting space. New with the remodel you can rent half of the hall.

Rental Information

The Fenton Township Hall can be rented for hourly rates during the week, or for the full day on Saturday or Sunday.

If there is no event on the Friday before your Saturday rental, there is an option to add Friday evening to your rental for additional set up and decorating time for your event.

Rent the full length of the hall, half of the hall, or book the main floor meeting room to meet your event needs.

At the April 18, 2023 Fenton Township Board meeting the Board adopted Ordinance No.843: State of Michigan Construction Code.

This ordinance brings in the trades for Fenton Township administration and enforcement. This includes the Electrical, Mechanical,

and Plumbing permits that previously were through the State of Michigan.

Genesee County Recycle Day

For 2023 Genesee County is doubling their Recycling Day events.

According to the Genesee County Metropolitan Planning Commission, all eight of the Recycle Day events are by appointment only and appointment registrations will open two weeks before the first event of each month.

You must bring proof of registration for the event in either digital or printed format. Without proof of registration, you will be turned away.

Hosting a Summer Event? Don't Forget...

No Open Burning

There is no open burning within Fenton Township. Agricultural zoned parcels only may request a burn permit as outlined in Ordinance No. 530.

Residents can have small fires for outdoor cooking that are no larger than 3' x 3' x 3'; no burning of leaves or grass clippings.

Large recreation fires, i.e. bonfires are prohibited.

Spray For Mosquitos

As part of the Fenton Township contract with Advanced Pest Management, residents can request up to three sprays a year. Best for before an Open House or other outdoor event.

Garage Sale Permit

You do need a permit (no charge just documentation) to host a garage or yard sale in Fenton Township.

You can stop in at the Fenton Township office or print off the "Garage Sale Permit" from the Township website and drop it off in our afterhours drop box.

Get An Amplified Sound Permit

Prior to using amplified sound in conjunction with an outdoor activity (i.e. weddings, open houses, parties) the property owner/occupant must apply for and obtain an amplified sound permit. Please apply at least three (3) days prior to your event. Cost: \$5.00

2023 Mosquito Treatment

Once again Fenton Township has contracted APM Mosquito Control (APM) to provide this service for 2023. APM has a field office located in Flint, MI. and administrative offices in Armada, MI.

APM Mosquito Control specializes in municipal and community-wide mosquito management

programs. APM has over 30 years of experience in integrated mosquito management.

There is an opt out of treatment form available on the Fenton Township website under the Mosquito Control section. Note that opting out of treatment does not relieve you from paying the voted millage.

Spring and Summer Weather

In Michigan, the weather is constantly changing and severe weather out breaks can look different throughout the year.

As we approach spring, the winter storms should be behind us though we did have a frost advisory in mid-May. Spring and summer severe weather, including tornado season, is on its way.

Common weather alerts for our area during the spring and summer include:

- **Heat Advisory** - Issued when the heat index value is expected to reach 100-104 degrees within the next 12 to 24 hours.
- **Excessive Heat Warning** - Issued when the heat index value is expected to reach or exceed 105 degrees, or higher, within the next 12-24 hours.
- **Severe Thunderstorm Watch** - Be Prepared! Severe thunderstorms are possible in and near the watch area. Stay informed and be ready to act if a severe thunderstorm warning is issued.
- **Severe Thunderstorm Warning** - Take Action! Severe weather has been reported by spotters or indicated by radar. Warnings indicate imminent danger to life and property. Take shelter in a substantial building. Get out of mobile homes that can blow over in high winds. Large hail or damaging wind identified by an NWS forecaster on radar or by a trained spotter/law enforcement who is watching the storm.
- **Tornado Watch** - Be Prepared! When severe thunderstorms and tornadoes are possible in and near the watch area. It does not mean that they will occur. It only means they are possible.
- **Tornado Warning** - Take Action! Issued when a tornado is imminent; meaning a tornado has been indicated on radar and/or reported by a trained spotter/law enforcement who is watching the storm. When a tornado warning is issued, seek safe shelter immediately.

Emergency Management Plan Resources

We would like to encourage conversations and family planning about emergency preparedness.

If a Tornado Warning is issued can you answer the following questions? What about at work? Home? School?

- Do you have a plan?
- Where will you go?
- What will you do?
- Do you know the alert systems in your area?
- How will you communicate?
- Are your pets part of your plan?
